

STRATEGICALLY LOCATED TO TRANSPORT CARGO



The Port of Lewiston has become a vital hub for a large-scale renewable-energy project in Alberta, Canada.

Eighty-four giant wind-turbine blades are being unloaded and staged for transport at the Port. The blades, each measuring 255-feet long, were manufactured overseas and are bound for the Jenner Wind Power Projects in Alberta, Canada. Together, the three existing Projects have a generation capacity of 303 megawatts.

The Port champions renewable energy produced by dams on the Snake-Columbia river system, as well as wind-produced energy that complements it.


"Wind energy complements base load electrical generation from dams and natural gas plants," Port Manager Scott Corbitt said.

The turbine blades will be shipped north on U.S. Highway 95 by Omega Morgan, a heavy-haul carrier that has worked closely with the Port in recent years. In 2020, the

Port housed 42 unassembled wind turbines.

The benefits of this transport route extend throughout the region, as the barge and trucking crews patronize local hotels, restaurants and other businesses.

"As the most inland port on the West Coast, the Port of Lewiston is strategically located to transport cargo into the interior of the U.S. and Canada," Corbitt said. "We look forward to being a part of these important future projects involving river commerce on the Columbia-Snake river system."
