
FOUNDED BY US

Northwest RiverPartners was founded in 2005 as the Coalition for Smart Salmon Recovery. Its name has changed, but it continues to promote smart salmon-recovery policies to restore runs throughout the Pacific Northwest.

Northwest electricity customers have invested over \$17 billion in salmon recovery since 1981, making it the biggest fish and wildlife recovery program in U.S. history.

The results are mixed. The lower Columbia and Snake Rivers are seeing similar results to free flowing rivers from southern Oregon to southeastern Alaska. The bigger question is why salmon along the north Pacific Ocean are struggling as a whole.

Northwest RiverPartners is working with its members and policy makers to investigate this further.
